## CGHS College Planning Checklist 2022-23

#### JUNIOR Year & beginning of SENIOR Year:

- o Verify accuracy of your high school transcript. Are you meeting graduation requirements? A thru G requirements? NCAA core requirements?
- o **Explore your interests** at <u>www.cacareerzone.org</u> or <u>www.californiacolleges.edu</u>. Define what you want to do for a career and what education you need.
- Explore the educational pathways. Do you want to earn a <u>technical certificate</u>? A bachelor's degree or higher? Is on-the-job training via paid <u>apprenticeship</u> the right path for you? How about free job training?
- o Explore and select <u>college major(s)</u>. A <u>major</u> is your primary subject area of interest in college. <u>It does not have to be your future job</u>. Make sure that <u>colleges</u> offer what you want to study. Some colleges require that you declare a major when you apply.
- o Create your own college ranking. Use different resources to research colleges that fit your needs. Create a comparison worksheet. Narrow down your list to include dream schools, reach schools, and safe schools. Chat with college reps through Casa's College & Career Center.
- o **Register with the NCAA** at <u>eligibilitycenter.org</u> if planning to play D-I or D-II sports. *Send your SAT and ACT scores to NCAA. Code for SAT is* **9999**.
- o Free ACT/SAT Prep PrepFactory is a free test prep site. It breaks tests into bite-sized concepts and provides tips, practice sets, and a personalized study path so you can master the test. Give it a try at <a href="https://www.prepfactory.com">www.prepfactory.com</a>
- o Take SAT and/or ACT tests. If you plan to apply to a private or out-of-state university that accepts the SAT/ACT or play sports at community college, register for the SAT at <a href="www.collegeboard.org">www.collegeboard.org</a> and the ACT at <a href="www.act.org">www.act.org</a>. Ask your counselor if you qualify for a fee waiver. <a href="mailto:CSUs an UCs no longer accept SAT/ACT">CSUs an UCs no longer accept SAT/ACT</a> scores for admissions.

### September & October of SENIOR Year:

- o \$\$\$ Get your FSA ID. You want free money. Yes, you do. \$\$\$ for trade schools, 2yr and 4yr colleges.
- Attend the first <u>SRJC Jump Start</u> meeting. Oct 5th at 12:25 in the Multi. Be ready to start at SRJC <u>before</u> you graduate.

- o Check your ParentSquare emails/texts for JumpStart info & reminders. Check the <u>JumpStart website</u> frequently for upcoming events
- \$\$\$ FAFSA and Dream Act filing period begins Oct 1. Financial aid is first come, first served.
- o Register for the <u>SAT</u> or <u>ACT</u> if needed. CSUs and UCs no longer accept SAT or ACT scores for admissions. Most other schools are test-optional. If you decide to test, it should be completed by December of Senior year. Some prefer scores by November. Ask your counselor if you qualify for a fee waiver.
- o Free ACT/SAT Prep Try Khan Academy for free SAT test prep. Also, PrepFactory is a free test prep site. It breaks tests into bite-sized concepts and provides tips, practice sets, and a personalized study path so you can master the test. Give it a try at <a href="https://www.prepfactory.com">www.prepfactory.com</a>
- Attend Senior Overview Night for students and parents: Oct 4 @ 6:30pm in the Multi.
- o Check out the North Bay Construction Corps
- <u>CSU filing period Oct. 1 Nov. 30.</u> Apply EARLY before Thanksgiving is strongly recommended.
- UC filing period Oct. 1 Nov. 30. Apply EARLY before Thanksgiving is strongly recommended.
- o NCAA Student-Athlete Info TBD
- **o \$\$\$\$RJC:** APPLY for the <u>Doyle Scholarship</u> by completing the <u>FAFSA</u> or <u>Cal Dream Act</u> apps.
- \$\$\$ign up for 1000s of scholarships with one application at GoingMerry.com
- olf you need Letters of Recommendation for Common App, scholarships, etc., then complete the LOR Profile. Offer it to adults if they agree to write a letter for you. Request letters at least four weeks in advance.
- Request transcripts for colleges, scholarships, honor societies, etc.

#### November of **SENIOR** Year:

o Submit CSU and UC college applications by Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> o Q: Did you waive HI? A: Yes Q: Did you turn in the signed form? A: No/Unsure Q: Will you graduate without it? A: No Turn in the signed form.

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#### December of SENIOR Year:

- o *Politely* submit requests for letters of recommendation if needed for colleges or scholarships. **4-week notice required**
- o \$\$\$\$ Check under the 'Scholarship' section of the College and Career Center webpage weekly for available scholarships.
- **o** Have impressive community service achievements? Apply for the <u>Community Youth Service Award</u>.
- o \$\$\$\$ Choose from 1000's of scholarships at careeronestop.org
- o Sign up for <u>COUN 270</u>, <u>Introduction to College</u> if you plan to <u>attend SRJC</u>.
- o Sign up for <u>COUN 162.1 Career Research and</u> <u>Planning.</u> It's I-Search for adults – like you!
- o Are you on track to graduate? Not sure what you're doing after high school? Make an appointment with your counselor to get these questions answered.

#### January of SENIOR Year:

- Are you taking an online or JC class to graduate or meet A-G requirements? Stay on track to complete on time. See your counselor if you need help.
- o **Notify all colleges** you've applied to if you have insufficient Fall semester grades or if you have dropped a course listed on your applications.
- Maintain C's or higher this semester. If unsure why, ask your counselor

### February of SENIOR Year:

- o\$\$\$\$Apply for more scholarships. Just do it.
- o \$\$\$\$ Regularly check email for the FAFSA or Dream Act Student Aid Report (SAR), a summary of aid being offered to you. Save all financial communication.

## March/April of **SENIOR** Year:

- o \$\$\$\$ Monitor your email for college-specific financial award letters. Compare financial award offers.
- o UC Admissions decisions announced 3/15-31
- o Return the Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) to the college of your choice before the deadline. Failure to do so will likely result in losing your admission.
- o Student athletes planning to play Division I or II college level sports review your amateurism questionnaire and request final amateur certification on or before April 1, 2020

- Watch for housing information and payment deadlines. Schools with strict housing policies will rescind housing offers if you miss payment deadlines.
- o Submit online course grades needed for graduation. Send them to your counselor.

#### May of **SENIOR** Year:

- Submit <u>College Course Grade Notification</u> to your counselor for any spring college classes you have taken to meet graduation requirements.
- Meet the <u>Statement of Intent to Register (SIR)</u> deadline for CSU's and UC's: <u>May, 2020</u>. Most universities require non-refundable deposits to confirm enrollment.
- o SRJC: If you haven't already taken Coun 270, sign up now to take this important class during the summer.
- o Request final transcript to be sent to the university you will attend in the fall. Deadlines are usually in July. Colleges require transcript from each high school or community college you've attended.
- Sign up for mandatory Freshman Orientation. Failure to do so may result in college rescinding admission offer.
- Sign up for Summer School if you need itGRADUATE
